This talk is about the fight for women's suffrage and its interconnectedness with other women's rights issues. Many people think of this only in terms of the early 20th century suffragettes' militant tactics, but a much wider range of strategies were deployed, from at least the 1860s, with many of the key early campaigners hailing from our region. It is an important reminder that the 1918 Representation of the People Act, which gave women aged 30 and over the vote in Parliamentary elections for the first time, was part of a very long – and by no means completed – struggle for gender equality.
